WEBSITE LOGIN

- Use your email address
- default password is set to 1234 (you can change this once logged-in)
- Save website to your phone home screen

WEBSITE FEATURES

- Find a fill-in
- View your scheduled courts (available by 12 pm on the day of your match)

- View your upcoming matches
- Rosters
- Ladders
- Player rankings

PENNANT COST

\$90 per season - DTC members
\$140 per season - Non-members (Must be a member of an affiliated club).

FILL IN'S

It is each player's responsibility to find their fill-ins, and this should be done via the pennant website.

Messages will be sent to available players of a similar grading, and then you will receive a notification when someone confirms. **If you do not get a positive reply, you must let Tony Blom know by 12 pm on the day of your match.**

Fill-ins can be .5 ITN point higher or 1 ITN point lower (except when approved by the pennant coordinator)

RATING SYSTEM

All pennant players and fill-in players are requested to register as a player on [UTR and follow the DTC page](#). The DTC is moving away from ITN rankings to the UTR system. It is important that all players are registered, so the information captured in pennant results may be utilised in the rating system.

TEAMS

Players are in teams of 4 lines. Players should play in their allocated lines unless approved by the pennant coordinator.

TIME AND FORMAT

Pennants commence at 6 pm. Players play one singles, and one doubles set first to 8 games (first to a 7-point tiebreaker at 7 games all)

Scores should be entered on the website by midnight.

CONTACTING OTHER PENNANT PLAYERS:

If you require to contact other players for various reasons: for example, playing early or if your running late. Please do this by contacting Tony Blom 0404 128 323.

FORFEITS

No shows or failure to complete any match will result in your matches being forfeited. Please note repeated no shows may result in exclusion from the pennant.

FINALS

Week 1: All teams will play the first week of finals (unless there is an odd number of teams). Teams will be split into divisions. Top four teams will contest the A pool finals, and next four will contest the B Pool finals etc.

Week 2: Winning teams from week one contest grand finals in their respective pools. In the result of a tied final (including semis) the team who finished higher on the ladder will be awarded the victory.

HOLIDAYS

There will be no pennant played on public holidays. Some rosters may break during the school holidays.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

If the pennant is cancelled due to bad weather, you will receive an email. Points are shared in the event of a washout (including unfinished rain-affected matches).
